About this day: This is the 3rd Sunday in Epiphany. Epiphany means the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi (Matthew 2:1–12). Each of the Sundays in Epiphany uses a Gospel story to reveal to us who Jesus is. You are urged to listen carefully to those revelations.

We can help our volunteer January janitor, Becky Gosbee, by taking our bulletins with us, putting our hymnals back beneath the chair ahead of us, and straightening out a chair or two. Thanks to you and to our volunteer janitors who serve our church.

Did you know that the lectionary readings in 2023 are from series A. That means that most of the Gospel readings will be taken from the Gospel of Matthew; series B highlights readings from Mark; series C features readings from Luke The Gospel of John is interspersed into all three series.

Did you know.....Canada carried out its last execution on Dec. 11, 1962, when Arthur Lucas and Ronald Turpin were executed. Five years later, the government temporarily suspended the death penalty until 1976, when it was officially abolished. [Broadview, Dec. 2022]

The study will be held on Wednesday mornings during the first week in Lent, which starts Sunday, February 26. Session will meet by Zoom at 7 p.m. Tuesday, February 7. Donna will chair the meeting and Delite will offer the evenings devotions.

An idea: The empty section of the chancel, where the Christmas tree used to be, calls for attention. Someone suggested putting up a banner stand, hoisting a banner emphasizing the season of the church year. If so, we need a banner stand; others could make banners displaying seasons of the church year, Lent, Easter, Pentecost, etc. Symbols could be applied to the banner also. Sound like a creative idea?

About our hymns for today: When Heaven's Bright with Mystery was chosen, because it's an Epiphany hymn reminding us of the Holy Light, Herod and Rachel, hope and mystery. God Who Gives to Life its Goodness was chosen, because the sermon this morning emphasizes the goodness of God in all things. I Have Called You by Your Name also reflects the Gospel story, the calling of the disciples.

As we get ready for our annual general meeting, we pause to give thanks to those committee chair women for their service, as well as their efforts to provide for our annual reports. Thank you, too, to those who religiously serve on committees for the good of the church.

The funeral service for long-time member, Mary Hicken, was held last Sunday afternoon, despite freezing rain and difficult weather conditions. Many thanks to Rev. Debbie for her worship leadership, as well to those who made the service uplifting; thank you to those who contributed finger foods and helpfulness for the funeral reception following the service!
