The Search Committee reported that in their efforts to call a new or part time minister to our church, they were told there were 17 churches on the Island looking for ministers! That means we're joining them in vying for a minister from the same small pool that's available. Good luck, right?

A nicely supplied first aid kit was purchased for our church. It's located in the kitchen and is available to anyone in need.
